A Candidate must :

1. Plan 1

For students with a Master's degree

- 1.1 Hold a Master degree in Buddhist Studies, Buddhist Philosophy, Pāli or Sanskrit Studies, or in the final year of study for one of the degrees.
- 1.2. Have a grade average point of at least 3.50
- 1.3. Have a very good background in Pāli or Sanskrit
- 1.4 Have direct, working experiences in doing research on Buddhism for no less than three years, which are not part of any Degree study and have published, at least, two articles in strongly peer-reviewed journals or highly accepted proceedings.
- 1.5 Have a clearly defined complete thesis plan, which is well accepted as suitable to the PhD's level by the Committee of the PhD Programme
- 1.6 Have a TOEFL score of at least 550 (computer based 213), Internet Based 79 - 88 or IELTS score of 6.5. Those who do not have any of the test scores specified above will have to take the English Proficiency Examination of the Faculty of Graduate Studies on the specified examination day.
(Candidates who are native English speakers, or who have taken a full BA or MA degree in an English-speaking country, or who on the basis of an interview with the PhD Programme Committee can clearly demonstrate that their English is excellent, may be exempt from submitting a TOEFL exam result.)

2.2.3 Have a TOEFL score of at least 550 (computer based 213), Internet Based 79 - 88 or IELTS score of 6.5. Those who do not have any of the test scores specified above will have to take the English Proficiency Examination of the Faculty of Graduate Studies on the specified examination day.

(Candidates who are native English speakers, or who have taken a full BA or MA degree in an English-speaking country, or who on the basis of an interview with the PhD Programme Committee can clearly demonstrate that their English is excellent, may be exempt from submitting a TOEFL exam result.)
