Admission Requirements

A Candidate must: Plan 1

- 1. Hold a Master's degree in a related field with an overall GPA of 3.50 or higher from a university that is recognized by the Ministry of Education.
- 2. Show high English proficiency that meets the standard required by the Program; and have sufficient study, work, or life experience in order to justify exemption from course work.
- 3. Have a TOEFL score of at least 550 (computer based 213), Internet Based 79 88 or IELTS score of 6.0. Those who do not have any of the test scores specified above will have to take the English Proficiency Examination of the Faculty of Graduate Studies on the specified examination day.

Exceptions from the above requirements may be made by the Program Committee and the Dean of Faculty of Graduate Studies

A Candidate must: Plan 2

- 1. Hold a Bachelor's degree with first-class honors from an accredited institution of higher education or
- 2. Hold a Master's degree with a GPA of no less than 3.50
- 3. have a TOEFL score of at least 550 (computer based 213), Internet Based 79 88 or IELTS score of 6.0. Those who do not have any of the test scores specified above will have to take the English Proficiency Examination of the Faculty of Graduate Studies on the specified examination day.

Exceptions from the above requirements may be made by the Program Committee and the Dean of Faculty of Graduate Studies

CRRS 552, CRRS 553 and CRRS 554 are thus prerequisites to be completed before he can register for any PhD course.
