Admission Requirements

A candidate must:

- 1. Hold a Master's degree in related fields with a minimum grade point average of 3.50
- 2. Students with work experiences in related fields or have published in recognized national or international academic journals in the past 5 years will be given special consideration.
- 3. Have a TOEFL score of at least 500, TOEFL computer-based score of 173, TOEFL Internet-based score of 61, or IELTS score of 5.

Those who do not have any of the test scores specified above will have to take the English Proficiency Examination of the Faculty of Graduate Studies on the specified examination day.

Exemptions from the above conditions may be granted by the Programme Committee and the Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies under exceptional circumstances.

The Ph.D. Program in Multicultural Studies offers a comprehensive curriculum exploring issues of ethno-cultural diversity and citizenship in Thailand and ASEAN countries, China and India. It provides students with theoretical tools and practical training for advanced research on ethnic and religious diversity, citizenship and rights, involving research on ethnic groups, minorities, migrants, refugees, stateless populations and cultural communities in Thailand and ASEAN countries. The program's issue-based approach allows students to investigate their topics of interest from interdisciplinary perspectives drawing on anthropology, history, cultural studies, public policy, development studies, law, education, religion, languages and literature. The program is designed to enrich cross-cultural learning environment and constructive dialogues among students from various cultural and professional backgrounds. Proposal / Concept Paper

Please submit a research statement outlining a potential research project the applicant may undertake for their Ph.D. thesis. This research statement will contain:

- 1. an outline and overview of the issue which is to be investigated
- 2. a brief review of related literature or research which has been conducted in this area.
- 3. research objectives, relevance, and contribution.
- 4. potential research methods intended to undertake this project and potential research site (if applicable)

5. bibliography

Research statement should demonstrate the applicant's research and writing skills. It should be about 1,000-1,500 words excluding bibliography.

- A detailed transcript of a degree (for an applicant with a degree completion) 2 copies
- A grade report with course names and grades received from the first to the current
 2 copies
 semester prior to graduation
- A copy of identification card 2 copies
- A copy of house registration certification 2 copies
- A copy of proof of payment.
