- 1.2 Have a grade average point of at least 3.50
- 1.3 Have a very good background in Påli or Sanskrit
- 1.4 Have direct, working experiences in doing research on Buddhism for no less than three years, which are not part of any Degree study and have published, at least, two articles in strongly peer-reviewed journals or highly accepted precedings.
- 1.5 Have a clearly defined complete thesis plan, which is well accepted as suitable to the PhD's level by the Committee of the PhD Programme
- 1.6 Submit a certificate of English proficiency with minimum admission score:
 - IELTS at least 3 or
 - TOEFL INTERNET BASED at least 32 or
 - TOEFL ITP (test arranged by Faculty of Graduate Study, Mahidol University) at least 400 <u>Important Notes</u>:
 - English proficiency score must be taken within 2 years up to the admission date.
 - Application without submitting a valid English certificate will NOT be considered.
